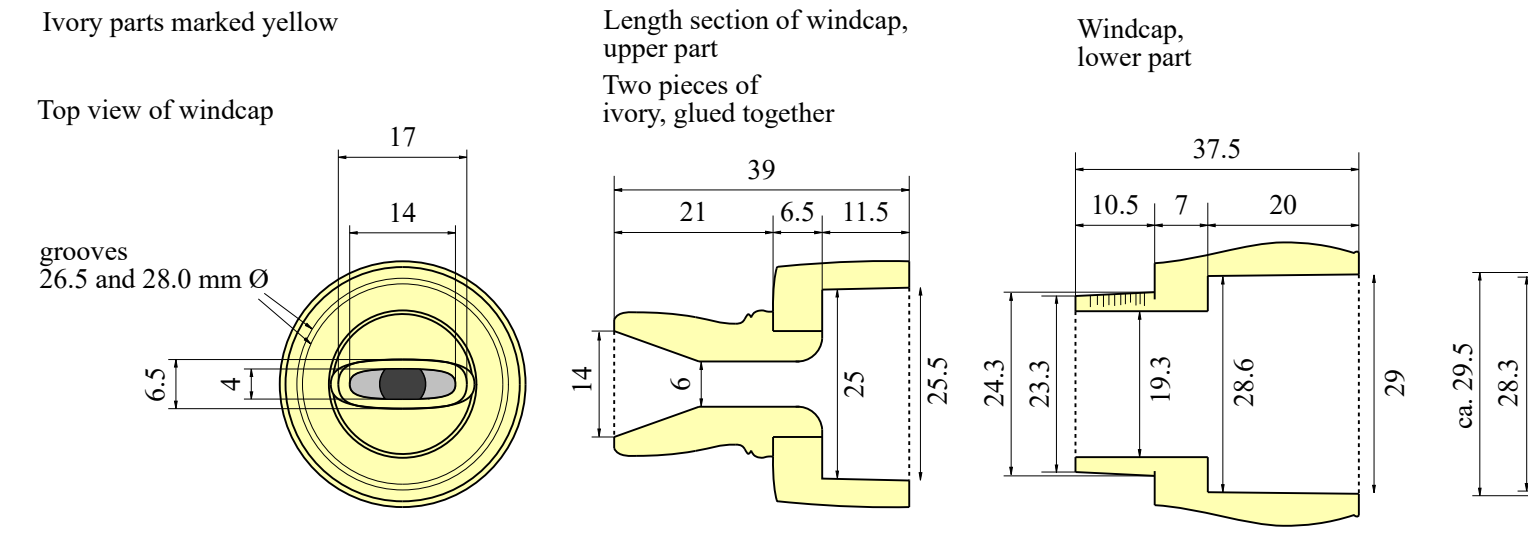
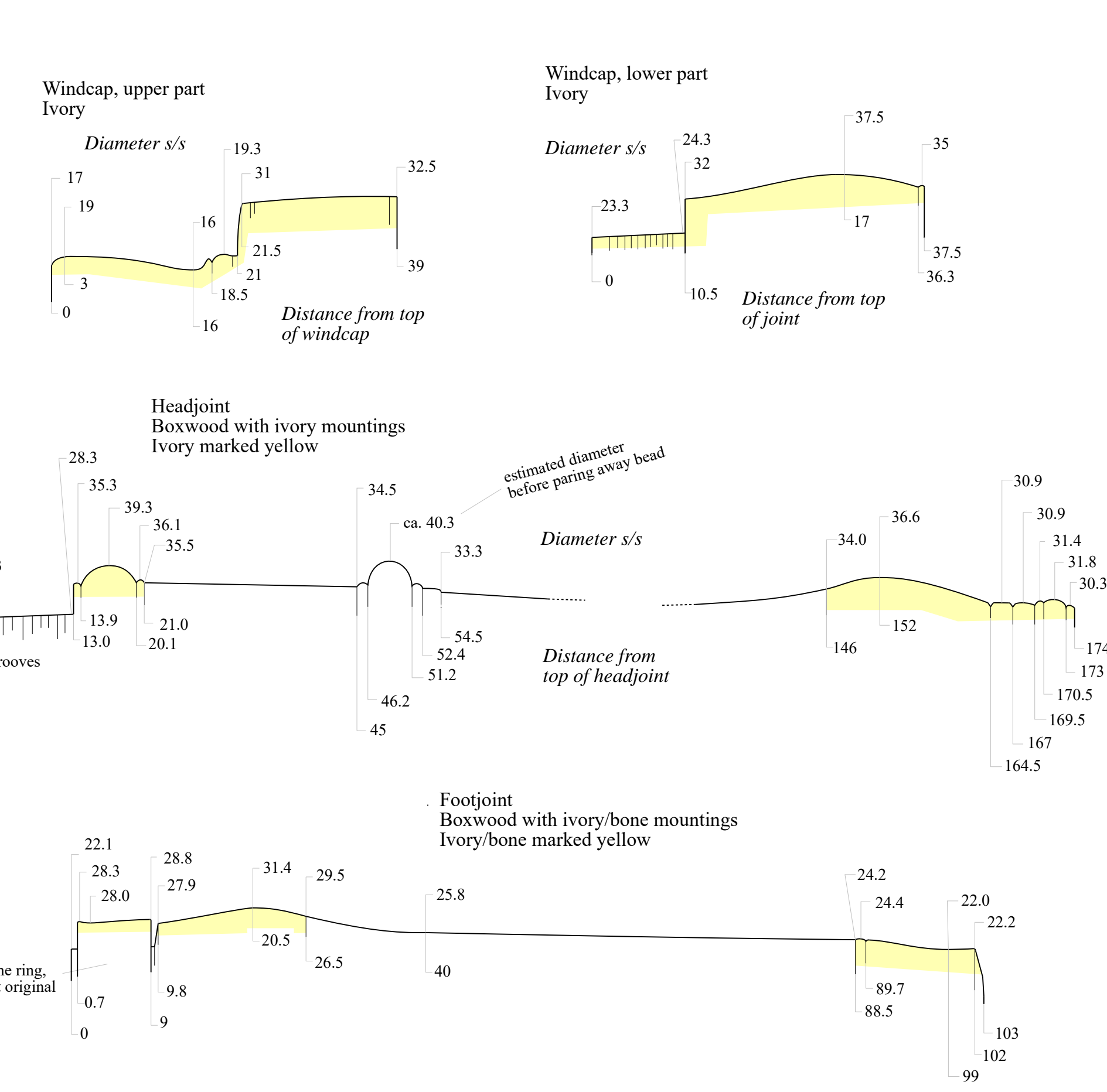

Turning details 2:1



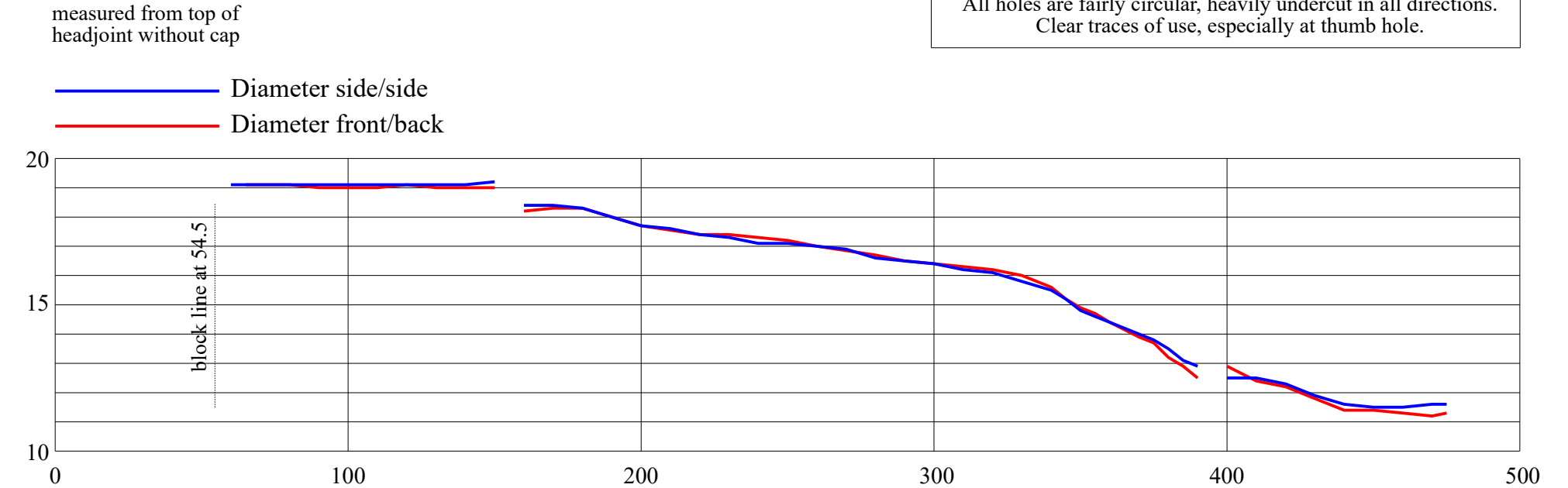

Boxwood recorder with ivory windcap and mountings. The flageolet-like windcap seems to be original. The upper end of the windway is badly damaged by pressure of the cap caused by moisture from the player's breath, and there is a heavy crack along the right side of the windway. The windway is so narrow due to the compression that inspection is very difficult and playing impossible. The front part of the beak (inside the windcap) has been removed. The pitch is estimated to a=426-430 Hz.
